Production Notes

Writer and Executive Producer Marc Weinberg lit the creative spark for *Outrage* with a classic challenge to his partner, Victoria Fraser: can we write a compelling story and limit it to a single actor in a single location? Fraser responded with enthusiasm.

By necessity, they needed a character who was a proud motor-mouth.

"Given the constant bombardment of opinions in daily life," says Fraser, "we realized no one provokes outrage better than a podcaster."

Inspired to take their character, Jake Gadling, on an unsettling journey of self-examination, the writers decided he would face a reckoning in the course of the story. Jake is abducted by an unidentified person who forces him to confront the impact of his public statements.

Weinberg explains, "It used to be that if you said something blatantly false or inflammatory, you could be held responsible. That's rarely the case these days, no matter where you stand on issues. Everyone's out to score points."

Ultimately, the writers hope to entertain audiences and stimulate reflection and conversation. "Words matter," Fraser says. "Whether centrist, liberal, or conservative, we've become so dismissive of other people's experiences. We can all do better. That's a good beat to hit right now."

Through Weinberg's former student, filmmaker Dmitry Milkin, the writers connected with Robin Rose Singer, an award-winning director based in New York. Together, they assembled a talented and resourceful crew eager to explore the script's creative challenges.

When Reed Birney signed on for the lead role, the filmmakers were elated. "We've always enjoyed Reed's work in movies and series," says Weinberg. "His commitment to playing Jake brought instant gravitas and dimension to the character."

While *Outrage* was conceived as a vehicle for a single actor, dramatic requirements meant expanding the number of roles in their story. "Jake doesn't know if his kidnapper is a rabid fan or a mortal enemy," says Fraser. "His life depends on whether he can find the right words to outwit his captor. Or exploit their vulnerability."

Reed Birney

Reed Birney has been working in film, television, and theater for decades. Among his earliest credits are Albert Innaurato's Broadway comedy *Gemini* in 1971 and Arthur Penn's *Four Friends* in 1971.

A celebrated member of the New York theatre community, Birney has won a Tony and numerous other awards and nominations for plays including *The Humans*, *Casa Valentina*, *Man From Nebraska*, *Uncle Vanya*, *Blasted*, and *Circle Mirror Transformation*.

Most recently, he starred opposite his son Ephraim Birney in *Chester Bailey* at Irish Rep, and in the highly successful run of Donald Margulies's *Lunar Eclipse* at Second Stage in New York.

On television, Birney played a recurring role opposite Kim Kardashian in *American Horror Story*. He also recently appeared in Peacock's *Poker Face*, and *Star Trek: Strange New Worlds*.

Other TV credits include HBO's *Succession* and Hulu's *The Handmaid's Tale*, as well as the Apple TV+ series *Home Before Dark*. He is well known for his performance as hapless Vice President Donald Blythe in the Netflix series *House of Cards*.

In film, Reed received a Gotham Award nomination for his performance in the Bleecker Street feature *Mass* opposite Ann Dowd, Jason Isaacs, and Martha Plimpton. The film's cast was honored with the Robert Altman Award at the Independent Spirit Awards.

Other recent film credits include *The Menu* opposite Ralph Fiennes and Anya Taylor-Joy, the Universal/Blumhouse thriller *The Hunt*, and Netflix's *The Forty-Year-Old Version* and *Lost Girls*, as well as *Strawberry Mansion*. He can also be seen in Kevin Costner's epic western, *Horizon: An American Saga*.

Robin Rose Singer (p.g.a) is a writer, director, and producer who specializes in commercial adaptations, true stories, and fun, fresh genre work with messy characters and big themes. As a director, two of her films were supported by Producer's Guild programs: spiritual thriller *Mala Sangre/Bad Blood* was chosen for the PGA Create fellowship.

The short film *Haider*, T , which she wrote and co-directed, was produced by Paul Feig's Powderkeg under a PGA x Google grant, with support from Panavision and Kodak. Her short *Interference* was selected for the prestigious NBC/Universal Film Festival, and she was awarded an Individual Artist Fellowship by the NJ State Council on the Arts. Singer won the IFP/Made in NY Series competition run by the City of New York, a half-million-dollar grant for her original pilot *Maturity*, a 2x Telly Winner for Comedy and Music.

She has written scripts for Passage Pictures based on Kurt Vonnegut Jr.'s *Hocus Pocus* and Don DeLillo's *The Silence*. Production is scheduled for a true sports drama *The Lions of Mesopotamia* and Chekhov adaptation *Ward 6* (co-written with Emik Davidov). Singer is also a staff writer for popular narrative audio dramas produced by Good Story Guild.

Other writing recognition includes: Academy Nicholl top 10 finalist, the Hit List, Black List Recommends, the inaugural MUBI x WScripted Cannes List of Women Screenwriters, and the Hollyshorts Short Screenplay Grant.
